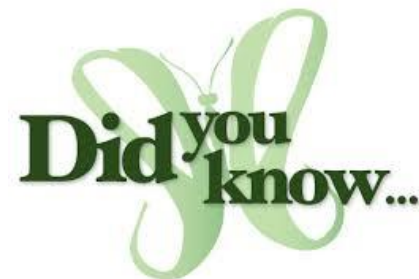

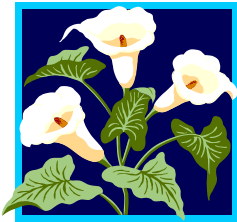

Annual Red Cross Spaghetti Supper (and Lunch)

The workers for this will be the twenty- plus members from the local community who are members of the Advisory Board of the Fairfield County American Red Cross. The profits from this fundraiser will be used to make several Heroes donations (\$1250/HERO – the average cost of caring for someone in a crisis) to the Fairfield County Service Center.

We are involved and are asking that you consider being involved, too. You can do this by donating blood, supporting the Spaghetti fundraiser, and contributing money to the American Red Cross. Donations may be made during the month of March during the worship service, mailed to the Fairfield Service Center of the American Red Cross, PO Box 314, Winnsboro, SC 29180 or given to any Advisory Board member during the month of March or at any time. Some important reminders about the American Red Cross are:

- The Red Cross is not a government agency and depends 100% on donations
- 91 cents of every dollar donated is invested in our community
- During 2013-2014 eleven families (fifty-one people) experienced home fires and during this time period \$11,533 has been spent providing emergency assistance to the families in Fairfield County
- Disasters can affect anyone and the Red Cross is there to help when they do
